Hertfordshire Constabulary are currently looking to recruit a new Police Chaplain to cover vacancies in St Albans and Broxbourne. To help us maintain a spread of Chaplains across a number of faiths, we are ideally looking for a Chaplain of Muslim, Hindu and Sikh faith, although this is not essential and we welcome applications from Chaplains of all faiths.

Police Chaplains are a group of volunteers that represent many different faiths. They provide support and pastoral care to police officers and staff that work for Hertfordshire Constabulary, regardless of their faith or religious belief. Over time a Police Chaplain will become a familiar and trusted friend.

As a Police Chaplain you will get to know police officers and staff by conducting at least two visits per month to police stations in your district. These visits will last for an hour or two and give you the opportunity to get to know the staff and learn more about them and their work.

In addition to your police station visits you will also be expected to attend a minimum of two other events per year, such as Chaplain's meetings at Police HQ in Welwyn Garden City, conferences or training events.

We are looking for people who are professional, sensitive to the needs of others and capable of providing impartial and confidential support.
